
Refugees at Home Impact Report

Refugees at Home was set up to address homelessness and isolation among asylum seekers and refugees.

Since we formally began operating in February 2016 we have provided over 145,000 nights of accommodation – nights that would otherwise be spent sleeping in graveyards, in stations or actually on the street (data as at 31.10.19).

This report is to tell you a bit more about our impact – who we have helped in nearly four years and what we have done to help them.




Who we help


Our guests are much more diverse than ever before. Each year we add new countries to our list. We have now hosted people from 75 different countries and some stateless people. This is many more (maybe predictably) than the 68 countries in 2018 and 54 in 2017.

The countries most of our guests come from have changed over time – it’s the same top six: Afghanistan, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Iran, Sudan and Syria. But Syria was the most common when we started, now it’s Eritrea with Syria fourth.

Guest referral summary



Refugees at Home has provided 145,000 hosted nights since 2015

Referrals have increased by c28% compared with 2018

48% of stays are for longer than 30 days

17% of stays are for 5 days or less

Our hosts

We do not record information on our hosts' age, sexuality, religion, profession or income – we focus on whether they have available accommodation and whether our home visitor (a volunteer with professional background in home assessment) feels that they would be a suitable host. Almost all our placements are in cities or towns, as our guests are nervous about staying in the countryside – or anywhere without transport links and connections to places they know.

Refugees at Home has c110 guests currently with hosts

We host c75% of the people referred to us

Refugees at Home managed to secure nearly 2000 placements

London is the largest region for guests, hosting 1.2K of the 1.7K placements since 2017

The Northeast and Northwest have seen growth from 22 guests hosted in 2017 to 46 in 2019
